

Commercial Pesticide Applicator Recertification Programs

April 4, 2012

The following programs are available for recertification credit hours for commercial pesticide applicators. All applicators must either retest or meet the recertification credit hour requirements by accumulating the appropriate number of credit hours per category or subcategory. Applicators may retest by taking the General and category examinations beginning in October of their expiration year.

Be sure to attend approved training and send in your KDA renewal application & fees to KDA by December 31st of the year your certification expires or you will have to retest to become certified in the following year. Program sponsors charge attendance fees which do not include the recertification renewal fee of \$50 per category that is paid to the Kansas Department of Agriculture.

Bring your certification number – *It is your responsibility to verify the date, location, credit hours & space with the sponsors. The identical course may not be repeated in the same year for credit.*
